5. EMS AGENCY REPORTS		
5.1 REMSA / EMD Update Bruce Barton	Restructuring of staff and divisions has taken place within Emergency Management Department. Originally comprised of five divisions: preparedness, community readiness, operations, REMSA, and business & finance. Duties and staff have been shifted and there is no longer a community readiness division. Currently there are 21 REMSA staff members and Riverside County has the fourth largest EMS system in the state. In another year our system will surpass 300,000 EMS responses. This will out-pace Orange County and making us the third largest EMS system in the state.	Information only.

	<p>to the strategic plan. The system assessment forms, narratives to the EMS plan, were distributed to the EMCC membership prior to this meeting for review and feedback. Bruce Barton pointed out that the EMS system standards and guidelines at the top of each form are antiquated and dictated by the State EMS Authority (EMSA). New standards and guidelines have been written but have yet to be updated by EMSA.</p> <p>Jason Keeling stated that overall the Riverside County Fire Chiefs' Association likes the plan and there are no big concerns.</p> <p>Bruce Barton noted that response time reporting standards has never been met for first responders. With the implementation of ImageTrend's Elite we will be collecting response time data from all EMS providers. He explained REMSA's draft Response Time Standard (Draft Policy 2203) which is out for written comment until July 21, 2017. REMSA has new policy, reflected in the draft EMS plan, requiring the International Academies of Emergency Medical Dispatch (IAED) Accredited Center of Excellence (ACE) for all REMSA approved Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) centers by December 2020. The deadline for written feedback from the committee members is set for 5:00 PM on July 21, 2017. This plan will ultimately be presented to the Board of Supervisors for approval.</p> <p>Some EMCC members stated they needed more time for their constituent organizations to review before they can provide feedback.</p>

This will only occur within Riverside County Fire Department's response areas.</p> <p>Brian MacGavin announced that the EMS systems strategic plan is going through the vetting process. A goal was identified to measure the impact that 5150s have on the EMS system. The strategic plan will not be finalized until the EMS plan has been finalized.</p> <p>Reyshawn Bobo reported that hands-only CPR and AED awareness training (sidewalk CPR) was offered during national CPR-AED awareness week from June 1 through June 7. There was staff participation from AMR, EMD, Riverside County Fire Department and Wildomar City. One hundred and eight people were trained.</p> <p>James Palmer reported that AMR Palm Springs and Hemet are now using ImageTrend.</p> <p>Melissa Schmidt introduced Ryan Walter. The Riverside County EMS Agency (REMSA) is working in partnership with the Riverside County Economic Development Agency (EDA) and American Medical Response (AMR) to distribute and install 18 public access automated external defibrillators (AEDs) at community centers located throughout Riverside County. AED placement was determined through a review process that evaluated several criteria.

To ensure operational readiness, AMR will provide all required maintenance and support associated with AEDs placed as an EMS system enhancement.
