I. Call to Order and Roundtable Introductions

Meeting called to order at 2:05pm.

II. Review of Compliance

Charts were distributed displaying the current and historical compliance in the Southwest zone and associated subzones through December of 2010. There has been consistent compliance over the period reviewed with no significant fluctuations. Responses within the City of Murrieta require that the ambulances stay behind the fire engines, therefore if the fire department arrives late, so will AMR. The historic reasons for this requirement were discussed. Exemptions and response-time-boundaries in the Southwest zone were discussed.

Responses have increased overall in the county, but particularly significantly in the Southwest zone in the last few months. This increase has also been mirrored in the Murrieta and Temecula subzone. Compliance has decreased in the Murrieta/Temecula subzone while remaining fairly consistent in the Lake Elsinore/Canyon Lake/Unincorporated area subzone. Under the terms of the new AMR contract, compliance cannot go below 90% during any month.

Wait time hours from the hospitals in this zone had a huge increase in recent months, prompting extra attention. Bruce has had discussions with Ken Rivers, and an effort should be made on their part to send a representative to these zone meetings. Trevor will make contact regarding attendance from their organization and other area representatives to ensure other local stakeholders can attend. The EMS Agency has not received sufficient data yet, but recent communication with Vicki at AMR indicates that Inland Valley and Rancho Springs hospitals have reduced their wait time hours by as much as 50%.

Wait time hours compared to transports received by the hospitals were discussed. Average wait times per patient were also discussed, but the averages don't do the patients justice, as the slow early morning/late night hours are averaged with the busy times. Actual average wait times per patients during the peak hours are much higher. As mentioned, the wait time hours at Inland Valley and Rancho Springs are decreasing, and the EMS Agency is monitoring the hospitals very closely. The new Paramedic Receiving Center policy (currently open to public comment) will ensure tighter compliance among the receiving centers in the County, as it sets specific performance and notification criteria.

Late responses over 10 minutes late were discussed. The Southwest zone has few calls this late by percentage, and the calls that are in this category are usually carefully scrutinized and a root cause analysis is often performed.

The EMS Agency has a duty officer on-call 24 hours a day, and will mitigate issues in real-time within the system, including issues arising from ambulances on-the-wall. The wait time hours are decreasing, but will only continue to improve if the system maintains pressure on the issue.

CAD and GIS data were analyzed using a projector. The Agency is building geo-fences around response time areas, subzones, and zones. Trevor analyzes response data using the AVL/GPS data from AMR's CAD system. Prior to the next meeting, we will have more maps plotted out and will send them to the stakeholders prior to the meeting.


Action Item: Trevor will need to confirm the response time at the Farm, north of the City of Wildomar.


III. Open Discussion


The Southwest zone meetings will be more frequent, occurring on a quarterly to semi-annual basis as needed.


IV. Next Meeting


The next meeting will be held August 1, 2011, at Murrieta Fire Dept.











