Extension of Expiration for Mark I Kits with Lot Number Lot 6TF914 and 6S4913

After careful research, we have determined that the existing stock of Mark I kits that will expire on September 30, 2011 can remain in the use by pre-hospital personnel until September 30, 2012 or until replaced by the County of Riverside, Department of Public Health (DOPH). We have reviewed the current literature and pharmacological data regarding Mark I kits and the medications included in these kits (Atropine and Pralidoxime) and have concluded that these medications lose efficacy very slowly over time and do not degrade into toxic byproducts.

We are actively pursuing funding options for the replacement of the expiring Mark I kits and will notify effected Agencies when replacements have been received.
