SUBJECT: EMS System – Seasonal Surge Event (Week 52)

DATE: January 02, 2018

The Riverside County EMS Agency (REMSA) is closely monitoring the impact of the 2017/18 influenza season on the Riverside County EMS system. During week 52 (beginning 12/24/2017), there was a total of 3415 emergency ambulance transports in Riverside County—a **31.1%** increase of the 2017 YTD weekly average of 2604 transports. The number of Ambulance Patient Offload Delays (APODs) in week 52 was 1183, representing an increase of **116.4%** of the 2017 YTD weekly average of 546.

Additionally, during week 52, Ambulance Patient Offload Time (APOT) county-wide was over 1917 hours, an increase of **98.4%** over the 2017 YTD weekly average of 966 hours. County-wide APOD hours for week 52 totaled over 789 hours, representing a **249.5%** increase over the 2017 YTD weekly average of 225 hours. Please see the linked Special Seasonal Reports.
