- TAC will continue to discuss the new Field triage standards from the American College of Surgeons to determine if REMSA policy # 5301 needs to be updated. Changes include: child unrestrained, active bleeding requiring a tourniquet, and suspicion of child abuse.

Policy:

PURPOSE

To establish criteria for downgrading from an advanced life support (ALS) level of care to a basic life support (BLS) level of care in the pre-hospital setting.

APPLICATION

The intent of this policy is to permit first response agencies to downgrade the expected level of care a patient will receive during transport so that the maximum number of ALS transport ambulances are able to remain in service, and available, to respond to other medical aid requests. If / when an ALS transport ambulance arrives on scene before a first response agency apparatus, and the ALS transport paramedic determines that additional ALS assistance is not required **AND** the patient's condition meets the criteria below, the patient should be transported by that ambulance. It is not appropriate for an ALS transporting unit to wait at the scene for a BLS transporting unit when the paramedic is able to provide a BLS level of care.

AUTHORITY

<u>California Health and Safety Code - Division 2.5: Emergency Medical Services [1797.204.]</u> <u>California Health and Safety Code - Division 2.5: Emergency Medical Services [1797.206.]</u>

GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS PRIOR TO DOWNGRADE

- Patients who require immediate medical attention will be transported to the closest most appropriate hospital.
- Patients who have received ALS interventions, or those who would likely benefit from ALS intervention(s), cannot be downgraded to a BLS level of care.

ALS to BLS DOWNGRADE DECISION MAKING PRINCIPLES

The three (3) following criteria <u>must</u> be met before a patient's level of care, and transport, may be downgraded from ALS to a BLS:

- 1. A complete paramedic assessment must be performed
- 2. No ALS intervention is warranted or has been initiated.
- 3. Paramedic judgement indicates that the patient does not require an ALS level of care.
 - a. If the patient's condition deteriorates during transport, the BLS resource shall transport the patient to the closest most appropriate receiving center and make appropriate notifications.

DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS WHEN DOWNGRADING FROM ALS to BLS

In addition to the minimum NEMSIS requirements, the following must be documented in the ePCR:

- After selecting *Patient Treated and Care Transferred to Another EMS Unit* as the disposition, "**BLS**" must be selected as the *Transporting Ambulance Level of Care* in the "Ground Transport" panel.
- Physical exam findings.
- Treatments provided, if any.
- All pertinent findings and observations.
- Patient, parent, or guardian is alert, oriented, and acting appropriately for their age.
- Indications that there are no signs of significant impairment due to drugs, alcohol, organic causes, or mental illness.

CONTINUOUS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

All patient dispositions where the level of care was downgraded from ALS to BLS will undergo 100% CQI by the ALS service providers.
