1. TXA trial study to be extended for an additional 18 months with end date March 2018. To date, Riverside County has:
 - 113 appropriate administrations
 - 14 patients that met criteria but did not get TXA (missed)
 - 11 patients that received TXA, but did not meet inclusion criteria (fallouts)
2. REMSA policy 5301- Field triage, 5302- Critical Trauma Patient criteria have been sent out county wide to the non- trauma centers.
3. Riverside County Trauma centers will be going through their American College of Surgeons consults/ verifications beginning Quarter 2, 2017.
4. There is a regional Trauma System Advisory Committee (TSAC) prior to Trauma Audit Committee that is open for field providers and hospitals to attend. Please send any trauma items/ issues you would like to discuss at TSAC to shkissel@rivcocha.org to place items on the agenda.
5. CA Gov signed AB 2007 sports concussion safety bill into law September 23, 2017. AB 2007 provides sports concussion safety requirements for community based sports programs. The bill covers training for coaches, parent and player education, removal from and return to play protocols. This bill was sponsored by CA Athletic trainers association, sport concussion safety is one of the top 10 issues identified in unintentional injury prevention strategic plan.

Stroke diversion by hospital is being tracked by REMSA and reported at the Stroke System meetings.

REMSA will be meeting with all prehospital receiving centers in Riverside County to discuss the importance of collecting data from all hospitals, including data on all stroke patients. This will give us a more global picture of the stroke patients in Riverside County and how our system is serving them.

Five additional hospitals have received REMSA's stroke center designation:

- Arrowhead Regional Medical Center (San Bernardino County)
- Kaiser Ontario Medical Center (San Bernardino County)
- Loma Linda University Medical Center (San Bernardino County)
- Redlands Community Hospital (San Bernardino County)
- Loma Linda University Medical Center Murrieta (Riverside County)

Patients who meet stroke center triage criteria may be directed by a Riverside County base hospital to the closest REMSA designated stroke center, regardless of whether the closest designated Stroke center is in San Bernardino or in Riverside County.

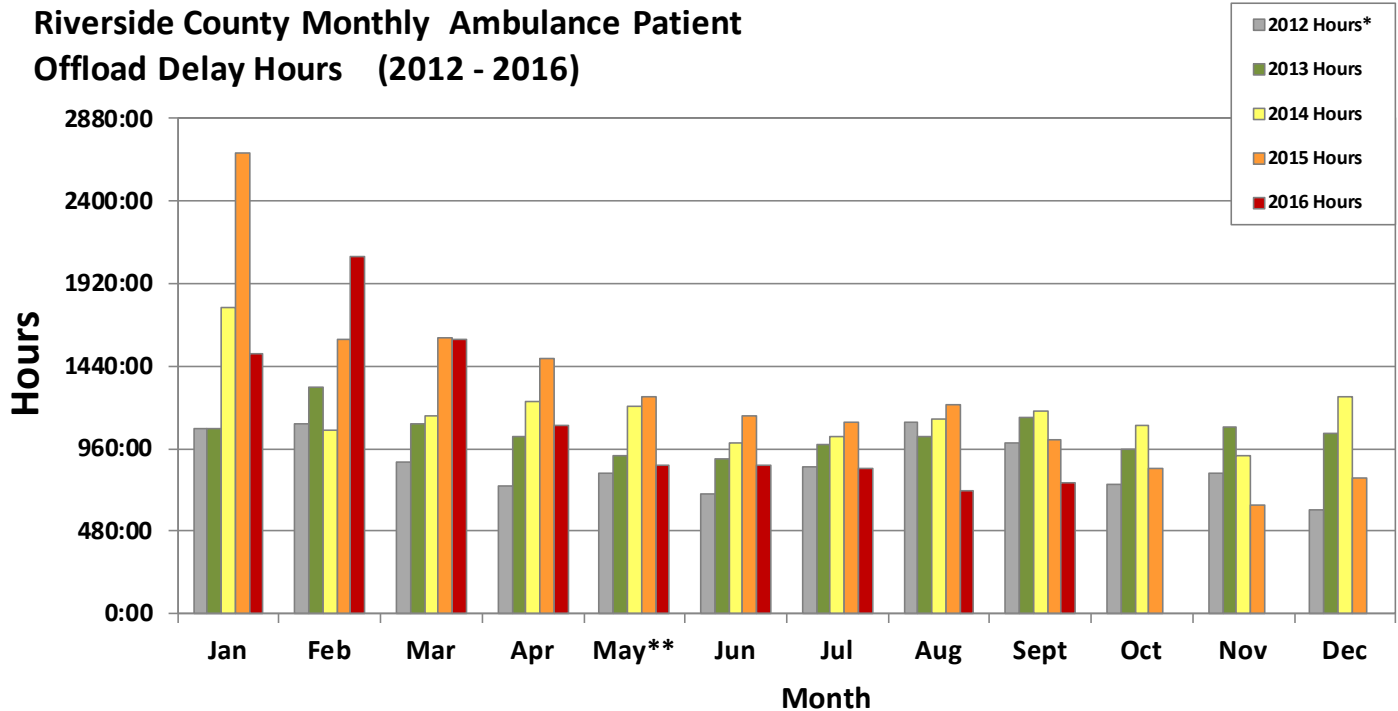
Historical Data

The data provided illustrates total ambulance patient offload delay time (hh:mm) by month for 2012 through the present month of 2016 from hospitals within Riverside County. To qualify for this chart, the duration of offload delay must be greater than 30 minutes (years 2013 and forward*), and only the time period after the first 30 minutes is summed.

*Prior to 2013, offload delay data used a 25-minute standard.

**For May of 2016, actual totals may have been slightly higher than are reported due to a 3-day CAD outage.

AMBULANCE PATIENT OFFLOAD DELAYS AND COMPLIANCE COMPARISON

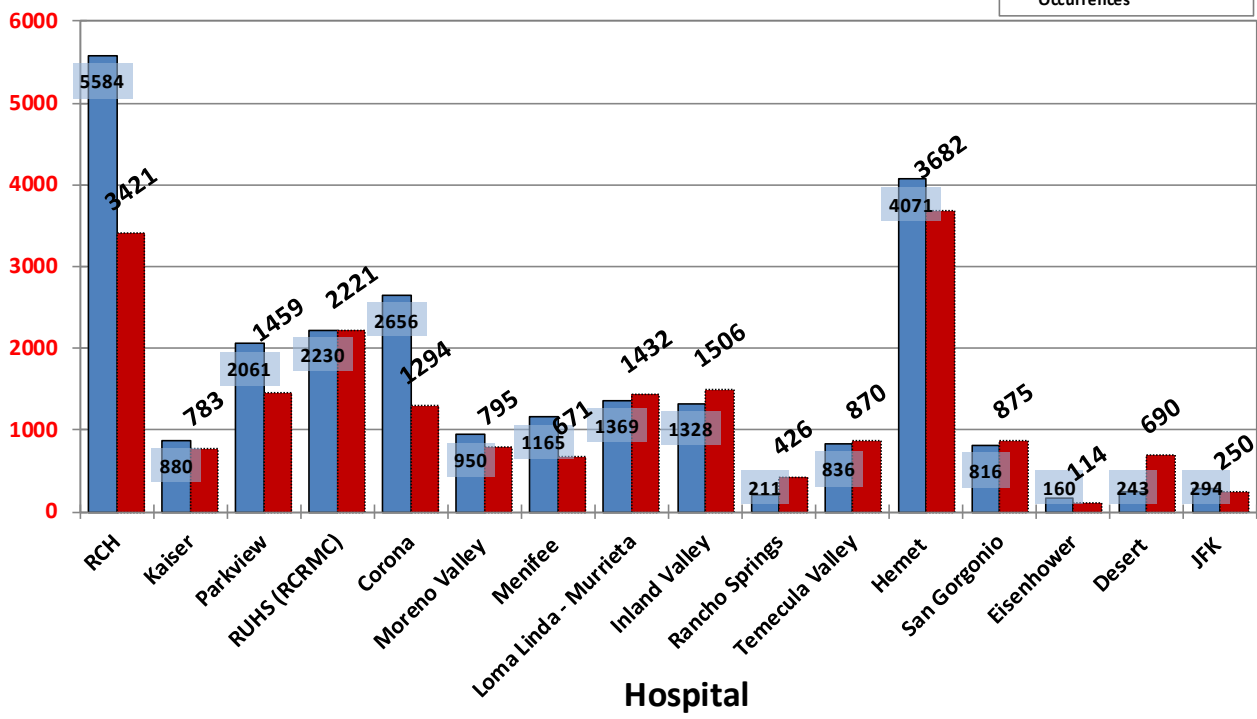

Comparing 2016 YTD to 2015 YTD Same Period (Apples-to-Apples)**



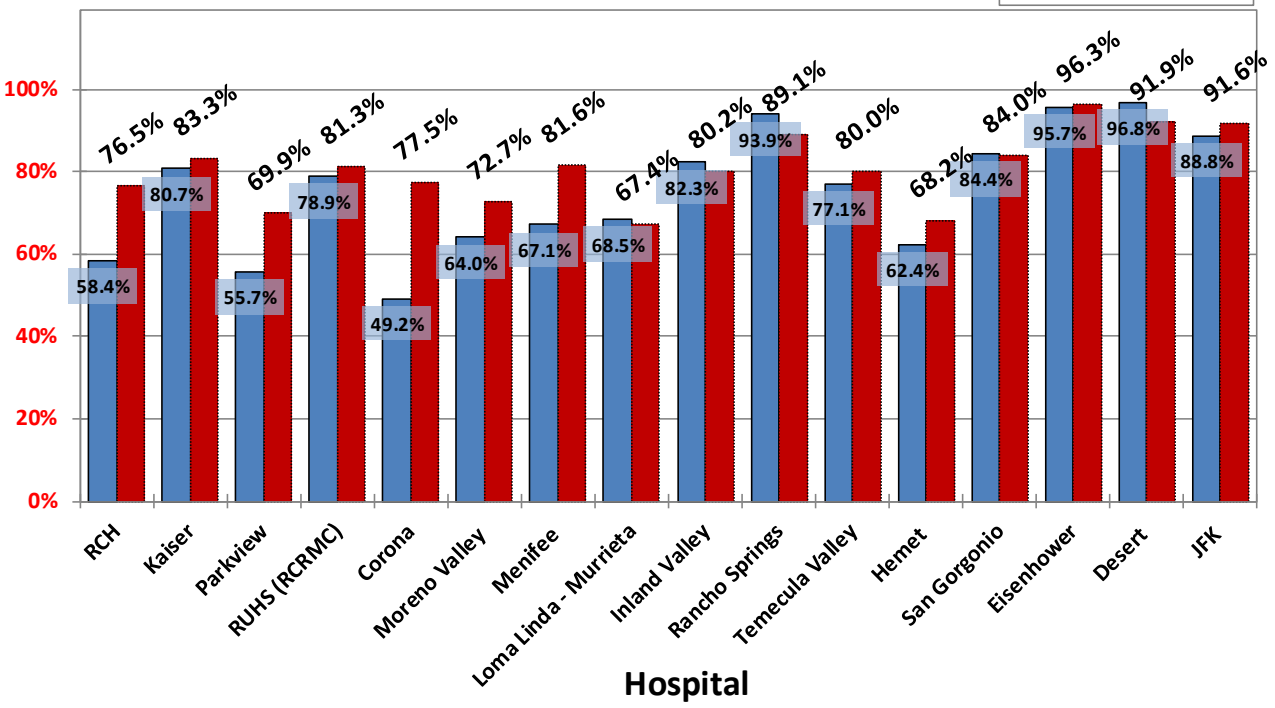
■ 2015 YTD Offload Delay Occurrences Same Period
