CQILT has decided that we will continue monitoring the same indicators in 2016 as we did in 2015 to ensure that valid, reliable data is submitted and that we have a good baseline. Indicators being monitored include:

- Missed STEMIs
- Scene time for suspected STEMI patients
- Glucose testing for suspected stroke patients
- Scene time for suspected stroke patients
- Direct transport to designated stroke centers for suspected stroke patients
- Cincinnati Stroke Scale performed on suspected stroke patients
- % of cardiac arrest patients transported to a hospital
- Prehospital cardiac arrest patients with ROSC (Utstein criteria)
- Prehospital cardiac arrest survival to ED discharge (transfer or admission to hospital)
- Prehospital cardiac arrest survival to hospital discharge
- Prehospital cardiac arrest survival to hospital discharge with a CPC score of 1 or 2
- Number of community CPR classes offered (include Hands-Only CPR)
- Number of people trained in the community CPR classes
- Number of times a BLS/CCT unit ran Code 3 and notified REMSA

In quarter 1, 65.2% of base hospitals, ALS transport providers, ALS and BLS First Responders and BLS CCT transport organizations submitted data. In quarter 2, 69.70% submitted data. In quarter 3, 90% submitted data. At this point, we have reached out to our Prehospital Receiving Centers to request data from them on these indicators as well, giving us a better overall idea of our entire EMS system. Data will be reported only at the CQILT meetings until we are able to get reliable, valid data from all providers and hospitals.

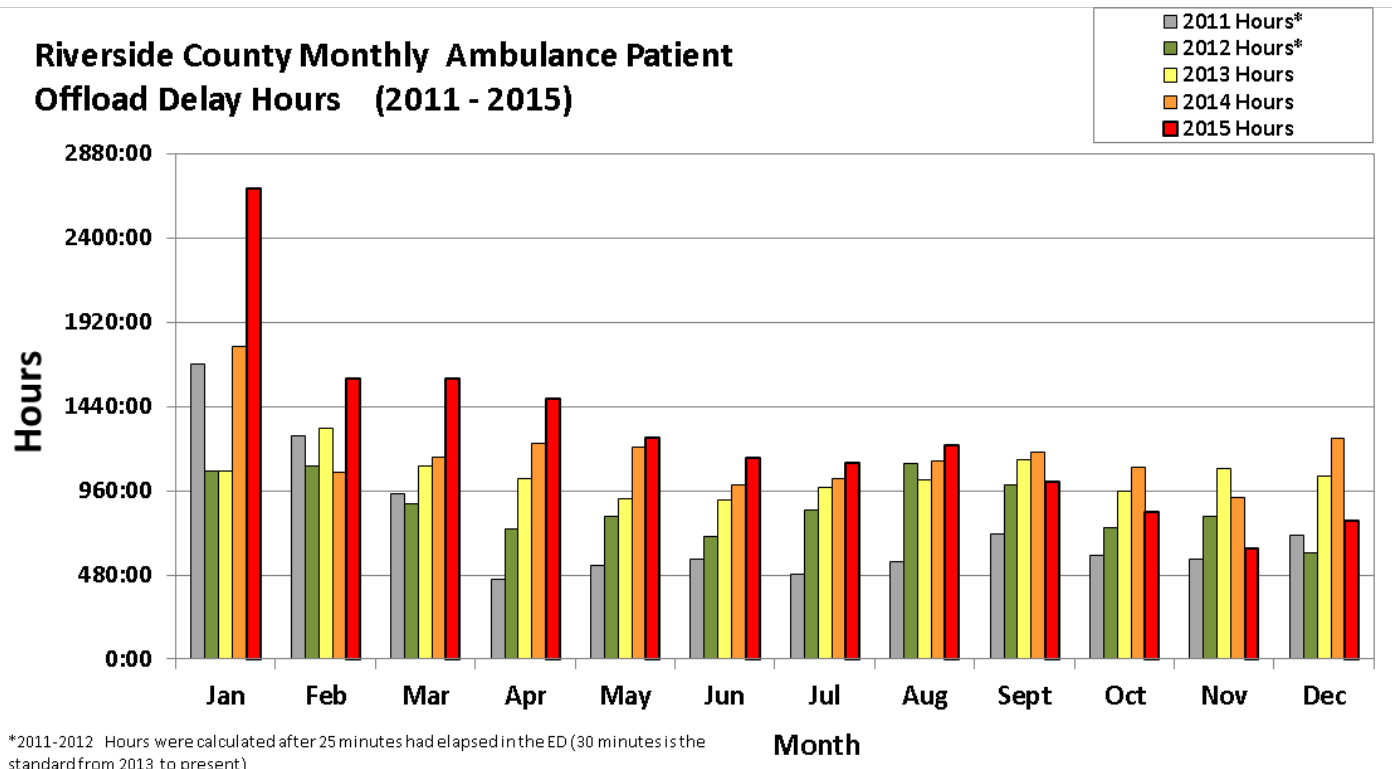

# RIVERSIDE COUNTY AMBULANCE PATIENT OFFLOAD DELAYS

## HISTORICAL COMPARISON

Data provided illustrates total ambulance patient offload delay time (hh:mm) by month for 2011-2015(present month) from hospitals within Riverside County. To qualify for this chart, the duration of offload delay must be greater than 30 minutes (2013 and forward) and only the time period after the first 30 minutes is summed. Prior to 2013, offload delay data used a 25-minute standard.

## AMBULANCE PATIENT OFFLOAD DELAYS AND OVERALL COMPLIANCE

This data includes 2014 and 2015 Ambulance Patient Offload Delays, hours of delay, total time the ambulances and patients were delayed, ALS transports received by each hospital, compliance, and average delay time per occurrence. "Delay Hours" include any time after the initial 30 minutes in the ED have passed; "Total Delay Time" sums both the delay and the initial 30 minutes. "Compliance" represents the percentage of ALS ambulance transports that were not held on Offload Delay.

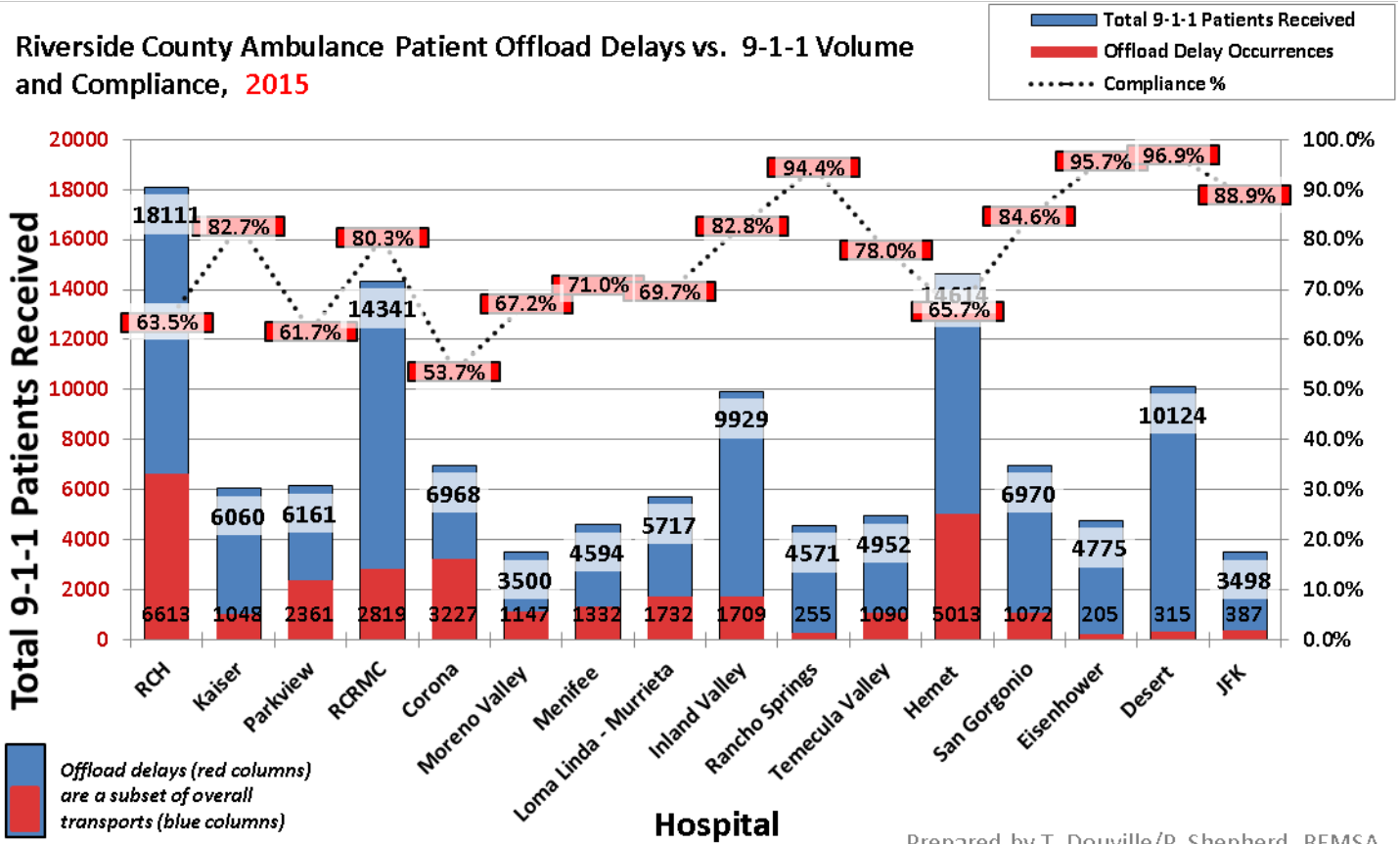

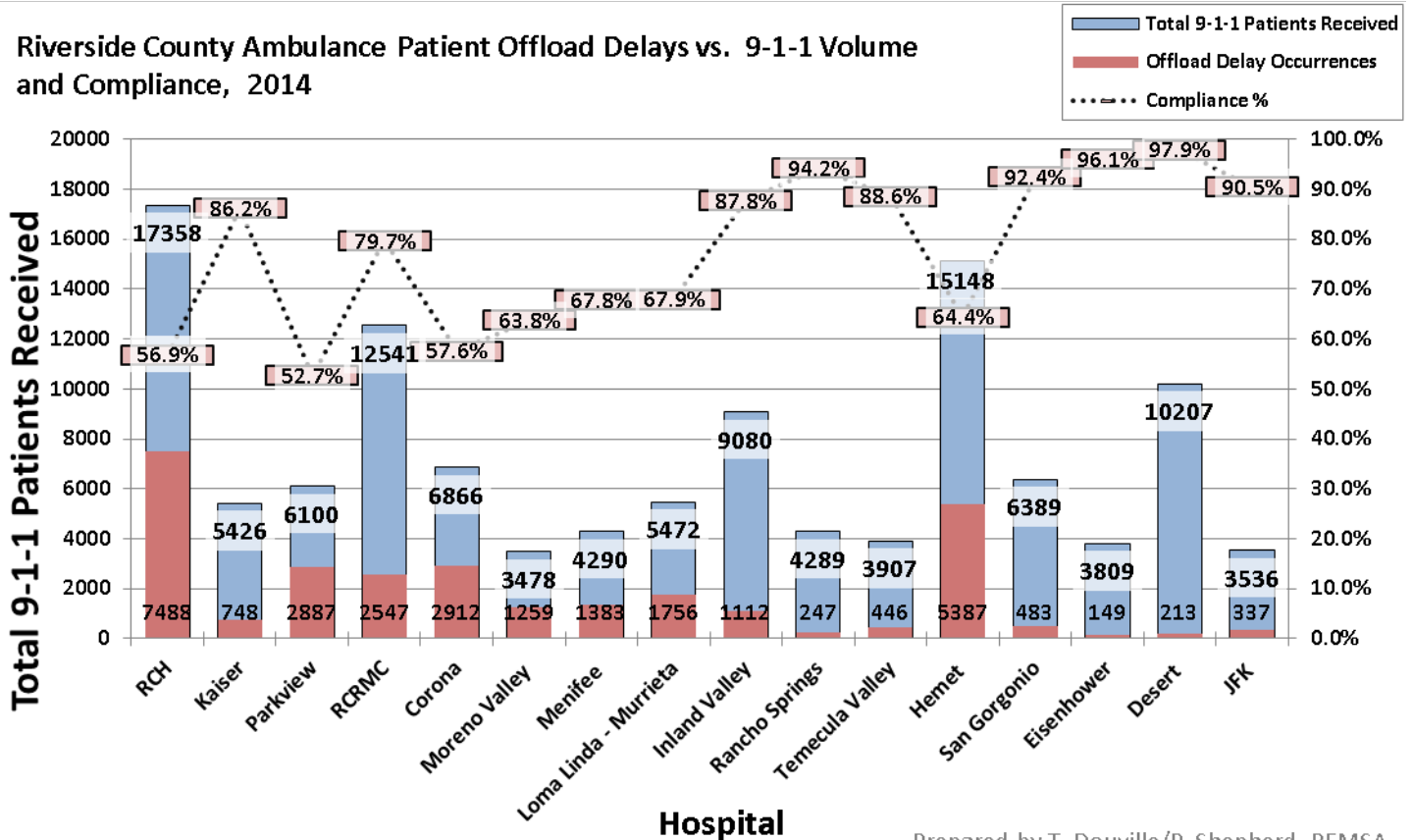


### Riverside County Ambulance Patient Offload Delays vs. 9-1-1 Volume and Compliance, 2015
