The Ambulance Patient Offload Delay (APOD) Policy (REMSA Policy 4204) went into effect on December 15, 2016. At which time the ambulance redirect pilot program was discontinued. Effective January 1, 2017, the passing of AB 1223 added language to the Health and Safety Code 1797.120 requiring local EMS agencies to adopt policies and procedures for calculating and reporting ambulance patient offload times using guidelines established by EMSA. The Monday morning conference calls are continuing to be an effective tool to discuss implementation, training, and technical issues. To date, the ImageTrend Elite electronic patient care report (ePCR) system, is implemented at Corona Fire Department, Riverside City Fire Department, Pechanga Fire Department, Mission Ambulance, PMT Ambulance, Murrieta Fire Department, and Cathedral City Fire Department. Since going live the abovementioned EMS providers have created over 5000 ePCRs.

While the ePCR project thus far has been heavily focused on data system configuration, training and data collection, we are now preparing for the improved reporting functions of ImageTrend Elite and on January 10, 2017 a Basic Report Writer training will be conducted to improve our capabilities for the next phase of data management – <u>Meaningful Use</u>.

Riverside County is officially submitting data into CEMSIS and as new users are added to Elite they too will automatically become compliant with CEMSIS reporting. A standardized report will be created to demonstrate the quality and quantity of data that is being exported/ submitted to CEMSIS.

Lastly, the Health EMS, (Sansio) contract will be terminated and the Sansio ePCR application will be turned off on **June 30, 2017.** All EMS providers still on the Sansio system must be off this system no later than April 30, 2016 to allow time for the final export of the legacy data out of Sansio.


RIVERSIDE COUNTY AMBULANCE PATIENT OFFLOAD DELAYS

Historical Data

The data provided illustrates total ambulance patient offload delay time (hh:mm) by month for 2012 through the present month of 2016 from hospitals within Riverside County. To qualify for this chart, the duration of offload delay must be greater than 30 minutes (years 2013 and forward*), and only the time period after the first 30 minutes is summed.

*Prior to 2013, offload delay data used a 25-minute standard.

**For May of 2016, actual totals may have been slightly higher than are reported due to a 3-day CAD outage.

AMBULANCE PATIENT OFFLOAD DELAYS AND COMPLIANCE COMPARISON

This data compares 2016 YTD to 2015 **YTD same period** (apples-to-apples) for: Ambulance Patient Offload Delays (APODs), hours of delay, total time the ambulances and patients were delayed, ALS transports received by each hospital, compliance, and average delay time per occurrence. "Delay Hours" include any time after the initial 30 minutes in the ED have passed; "Total Delay Time" sums both the delay and the initial 30 minutes. "Compliance" represents the percentage of ALS ambulance transports that were not held on Offload Delay.




