Please see list of updated PUC policies/REMSA policies for July 1, 2025:

Abbreviated Updated Policies from PUC:

SCV – Calculating and Preparing Medication Dosage: IN TXA added for 2.5 volume administration

3303 – updated with additional Epi volume (1:1000 10mg/10ml)

3308 – removed (see REMSA EMS System Advisory #2025-06/30)

4100 – renumbered from 4101

4101 – NEW *Universal Patient Protocol*

4104 – updated with IN dose for TXA (2.5 ml allowed only for TXA for epistaxis)

4105 –

- Single dose administration language added to pertinent medications
- Cardiac Arrest reference updated to “Medical Cardiac Arrest”
- Adenosine - Alternate route added. WPW language removed
- Albuterol – ESRD language updated and added 4403
- Calcium Chloride – ESRD language updated and added 4403. Special information updated to clarify use and indications
- 4801 – Neonatal Resuscitation/OB updated to pertinent medications. Neonatal resuscitation references to 4405 added where pertinent
- Diphenhydramine – IVP/IOP/IM pediatric dose updated with max single dose language
- Epinephrine – PDE updated with policy numbers as indicated. Neb Epi added for croup treatment. ROSC after traumatic arrest added to contraindication language for infusion.
- Glucagon – added 4801 to indication as it was added to the policy. Added neonate language to special considerations section
- Naloxone - added 4801 to indication as it was added to the policy, no longer a BHO for initial dose
- NS - added 4801 to indication as it was added to the policy (10 ml/kg)
- Ondansetron – added max 12 mg to the pediatrics dose



- Sodium Bicarbonate – ESRD language updated. Added 4801 to indication as it was added to the policy
- TXA – added PPH and epistaxis treatment. Language added to contraindications

4108 – added Do Not Resuscitate language for the neonate/preemie patient

4202 – TXA treatment for epistaxis was added along with BLS treatment

4301 – Traumatic Arrest language removed

4302 – Name updated *Traumatic Injuries/Traumatic Arrest*. All traumatic arrest language in this policy

4403 – ESRD language add with treatment. Adenosine alternate route added. Added pediatric joules to sync. Cardioversion

4404 – Updated ESRD language

4405 – name updated *Medical Cardiac Arrest*. Removed traumatic arrest language. Added neonatal doses for resuscitation.

4406 – added language for Croup treatment/Neb Epi

4801 – NEW *Obstetrical Emergencies/Newborn Deliveries*

SIDE NOTE:

4602, 4704, 4705 – “Normal Saline” added in front of referenced bolus’ as it was missing, clerical error

5301 – updated language for consistency/formatting
